## Dear Parents,

I hope you have a wonderful summer break; I have enjoyed welcoming the children back into Seahorses Class this week. We will begin the term with a learning theme linked to toys, old and new. Please see a brief overview below, of the planned curriculum for this half term.

Your child will receive a new reading book next week and a new sharing book to bring home this weekend. We continue to adopt a similar approach to reading as last year, following the Little Wandle phonics and reading scheme. Your child will read the book they bring home 2 times at school; therefore, they will be familiar with the words and context of the book. If they are finishing the book too challenging, please speak to one of the members of staff. We kindly ask that books are handled carefully and returned to school in good condition, this is key to sustaining our books for further teaching.

We will be using a slightly different recording system for promoting reading at school this year. You will receive more information about this in a separate letter.

Please could your child keep a pair of wellies at school for any outdoor learning or rainy days. P.E lessons will be on Tuesdays and Fridays; please could your child wear their P.E kit to school on these days. This system worked well last year as it increases the amount of time children are physically active, rather than getting dressed and reduces the amount of lost property.

Spellings and Mathematics homework will commence from Friday 16<sup>th</sup> September, detailed information regarding timescales etc will be sent out on this date.

As your child continues their journey in Key Stage 1, they are still entitled to a healthy morning snack, this is usually a piece of fruit or vegetables. If you would prefer to send your child into school with a healthy snack this is fine. Each child needs to bring a water bottle to school daily, we can refill this for them when needed.

English	Our English lessons will be based upon the books
	of; The 3 Little Pigs, The 3 Little Wolves and the
	Big Bad Pig, The Colour Monster, Traction Man
	and The Lost Toys in the Museum. The children
	will be writing narratives, recount and poetry.
Mathematics	The first focus this term will place value and
	securing a good understanding of number. The
	second focus will be shape.
Science	Our science lessons will be based on materials
	and their properties. The children will be naming

	materials and their properties and testing
	materials for specific purposes.
Music	The children will be using untuned instruments
	to replicate the sounds and rhymes produced by
	toys.
R.E	Our R.E lessons will be based on Christianity,
	exploring the Creation story and Harvest Festival.
Art and Design	In art lessons with Mrs Richards and Mrs Prout,
	the children will be designing and making the 3
	Little Pigs houses, focusing on lines, texture, and
	collage. We will also be exploring how to make
	different colours to use in an Autumn scene.
P.E	P.E lessons will develop the children's
	fundamental skills- moving, negotiating space,
	throwing, and catching a variety of balls, kicking
	and receiving a ball. This will lead on to applying
	these skills in a competitive game.
Cornish	Our Cornish lessons this term will include:
	numbers (up to 20), identifying colours and
	clothing. We will also be learning a Cornish
	Counting song.
PSHE	We begin the term by introducing school
	expectations, exploring, and recognising feelings,
	identifying what makes us special and learning
	about different families.
	Every week we share Picture News which
	promotes conversation about relevant issues
	around the world.
Computing	We are looking forward to welcoming the
	Cognition and Learning team back into Class on
	Friday afternoons.
