


# Spring Term 1 : 2023-2024




## Dolphin Class



### English—writing

We will be reading *The Iron Man* and using the Talk for Writing approach to write our own defeating the monster stories. There will also be a strong focus on our handwriting, spelling, punctuation and grammar. Children will have regular opportunities to write at length and develop their writing stamina. We will continue to use the Spelling Shed for our spellings and this can be accessed at home.



### English—reading

Reading will be a big focus for us this year. The majority of children have made progress in their Accelerated Reader Star Reading assessments. Reading every night makes a significant difference to your child's progress. We are expecting more new books for the library very soon, but I am always happy to purchase specific books if it encourages a child to read more.

### Maths

This term we will be working with fractions in both lower and upper KS2. We will be continuing the 99 Club times table challenge each day and children have access to Complete Maths to continue their learning at home.

### History

This half term we will be learning about the Indus Valley and the ancient civilisation that once inhabited it.



### Geography

The children will explore settlements from villages to cities and will apply this knowledge through practical geography field trips.

### RE


The children have really enjoyed learning about Hinduism in their RE lessons and in this final Hindu unit we will explore the traditions associated with this religion.

### PE

Our PE days are Tuesday and Friday. The children should come to school in their PE kits and be prepared to be outside.

## Science

This half term the children will be learning about states of matter. They will carry out investigations that involve matter changing between liquid, solid and gas.

Our lovely French teacher, Mrs Ward, will be joining us again for French lessons. The children enjoy learning through games and have a wide range of opportunities to practise their skills.



## Music

We have received a number of guitars for the children to borrow this term and we will be joined by music teacher Jan Man who will be teaching the children to play.
